They had an opportunity to explore and experience many facilities offered in Science City such as the thrill of Time Machine, Cable car, Space Theatre etc. Some of the students even took part in the Science is Fun demonstration. They seem to really enjoy it. Being the students of Arts



discipline, they got first-hand knowledge on science subject to some extent.

The students were also taken to the first wax museum to be inaugurated in India, the famous Wax Museum. The museum has been named after Mother Teresa. The museum houses life-size statues of famous people from history and contemporary personalities from various backgrounds such as science, sports, music and films. It was a good experienced for the students acquainting themselves with different personalities.



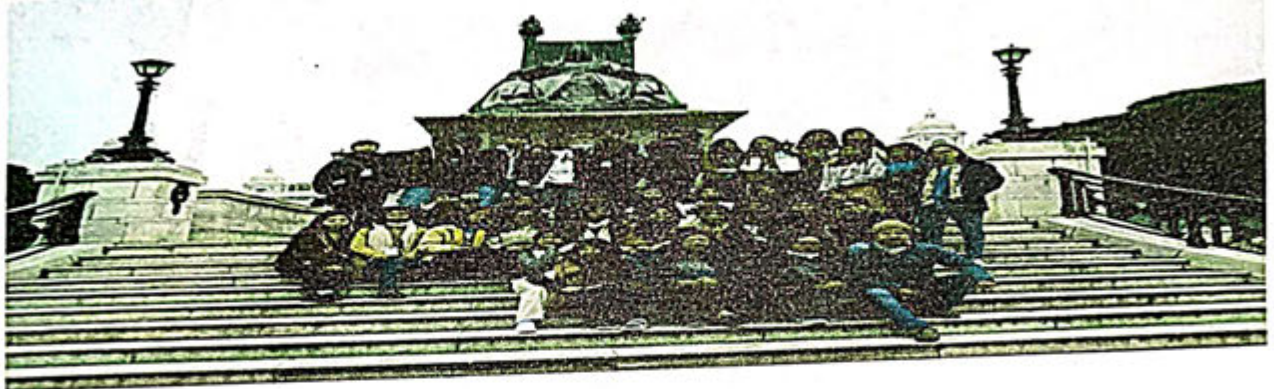
