Fig. 1.02: Pie chart representation of the responses of the students to Statement. No. 1.





This shows that most of the students are satisfied with curriculum imparted to them.




Fig. 3.02: Pie Chart representation of the student response to statement No. 3




Fig 5.02: Pie Chart representation of the student response to statement No. 5.




Fig. 6.02: Pie chart showing student response to statement related to No. 6

Findings:-



The above analyses have yielded some significant findings. In responses given by the dents the overall findings have been presented below

- Out of 28 respondents, it was found that 80-90% of the students have given highly positive answers i.e. they have given a strongly agreed and agreed responses. This shows that they are satisfied and appreciate the curriculum imparted to them.
- Very few students of about 10% have given a neutral response with the curriculum taught to them. This shows that they are yet to fully understand the curriculum provided to them. This maybe because of low attendance. It may also be because of lack of responses and attentiveness in the class.
- The findings also reveal that a very small percentage of the students have disagreed with different question regarding curriculum asked to them. This maybe because that curriculum imparted to them are not satisfying or are not meeting their needs. Some reason maybe they are not able to follow the subjects taught to them or have not fully understood. Very few students have strongly disagreed. The reason maybe because of irregularity in the class.

Action Taken:

- Orientations were provided in the beginning of the session and highlighting them about the curriculum and its outcomes.
- Encourage them to study by giving home assignments and class test.
- Strict attendance is maintained.
- · Giving time for students outside classes whenever they are in need.

Teachers Feedback:

Teachers are quite satisfied with the student's response but wish that the student develop good study habit for good academic performance. ICT class room and proper sound system is required for effective classroom transaction. Teachers are also satisfied to some extent with the curriculum but felt that it should be reviewed which will be at par with the CUET syllabus. So that it will be easy for the students to prepare for their entrance exams. Teachers can also review their performance in order to make the class interesting and motivate students to learn.

Summary:

From the survey on curriculum feedback conducted for V Semester class, it was found that the curriculum imparted has helped the students gain knowledge to some extent for the future educational practices. The methods of teaching and learning implemented are quite effective for the students. It is observed that the curriculum provided lies within their capacity to understand since majority of the students are able to respond positively to the questionnaire.






Fig. 3.02: Pie Chart representation of the student response to statement No. 3




Fig. 6:02: Pie chart representation of student response to statement no. 6



Findings:-



The above analyses have yielded some significant findings. In responses given by the students the overall findings have been presented below:

- From the analyses, it was found that majority of the students have strongly agreed and agreed to all the statements related to curriculum. This shows that majority of the students are quite satisfied with the curriculum imparted to them and found to be quite effective.
- It was found that in statement No.6 there is mixed reaction that curriculum delivery is followed according to the academic calendar. Although the institution tries to stick to academic calendar but there are usually certain situation arises where it needs to adjust with the scheduled dates. However the syllabus is always completed before examination.
- There are only few students who disagree or strongly disagreed to most of the statements given. This maybe that it is not their subject of interest or maybe they are not satisfied with curriculum imparted to them.

Action Taken:

- Orientation was given to the students in the beginning of the sessions highlighting about various activities involved in the curriculum.
- Making subjects interesting by using different methodologies like discussion, seminars and educational tours.
- Motivate the students to have a regular study habits and to have a competitive spirit. Apart from studies, students are also encouraged to take part in co-curricular activities.

TEACHERS FEEDBACK:

 Teachers are quite satisfied with the teachings and its effectiveness with few improvements in the methodology. Infrastructure improvement is also required as classrooms are not enough. Students' number exceeds the limit and both the students and teacher find difficulty while transacting teaching learning process. Students need more motivation for regular attendance, to have a competitive spirit for better academic record and performances. Teachers are satisfied with the curriculum provided. Hence the same curriculum can be continued.

SUMMARY:

From the Survey on Curriculum Feedback conducted for the Students of IIIrd Semester, we have come to the conclusion that majority of the students are satisfied with the total learning activities provided to them. Overall, the curriculum imparted to them is relevant to their practical life and it will help them a lot in their future course of action.

Therefore, it may be noticed that majority of the students are of the opinion that the curriculum delivered to them is well planned and effective.



Fig 2.02: Pie Chart representation of the student response to statement No. 2.














Fig 5.02: Pie Chart representation of the student response to statement No.5

Findings:-



The above analyses have yielded some significant findings. In responses given by the students the overall findings have been presented below:

- Encourage them to be more active not only in studies but also to take part in cocurricular activities.
- Strict attendance is maintained.

- Career guidance and counselling were given to them.

TEACHERS FEEDBACK:

 Teachers are quite satisfied with the teachings and its effectiveness with few improvements in the methodology. Infrastructure improvement is also required as classrooms are not enough. Student number exceeds the limit and both the students and teacher find difficulty while transacting teaching learning process. Students need more motivation for regular attendance, to have a competitive spirit for better academic record and performances. Teachers are satisfied with the curriculum but some course need to be updated to keep up with the demand of different situations.

SUMMARY:








Fig 2.02: Pie Chart representation of the student response to statement No. 2






Fig. 3.02: Pie Chart representation of the student response to statement No. 3

Fig 5.02: Pie Chart representation of the student response to statement No. 5



Teachers Feedback:



Summary:




